Popular 60's Cocktails

Why not help to spark up an appetite with a few pre dinner cocktails!



75ml Bourbon
15ml Sweet Vermouth
15ml Extra Dry Vermouth
2 dashes of bitters
5ml Cherry Eau de Vie
Handful of Ice
Orange Peel & Maraschino Cherry to
garnish (optional)

Pour all of the ingredients into a mixing glass, add cubed ice and stir.

When the desired dilution has been achieved, strain into a martini coupe.

Garnish with orange zest, making sure to release the oils with and around the glass.



50ml Bourbon
35ml Lemon Juice
12½ml 2:1 Sugar Syrup
2 Dashes Angostura Bitters
Handful of Ice
Lemon Zest

Shake all of the ingredients (except for the lemon zest) hard with ice and strain into an ice-filled rocks glass. Squeeze the lemon zest, shiny side down over the drink so the scented oils spray across the surface. Discard the zest, add the garnish and serve.

Bloody Mary

Large Handful of Ice
100ml vodka
500ml tomato juice
1 tbsp Lemon Juice, plus 2 slices to serve
Worcestershire sauce
Tabasco
Pinch Celery Salt
Pinch Black Pepper
2 celery sticks, to serve

Place the ice in a large jug. Measure the vodka, tomato juice and lemon juice and pour it straight onto the ice.

Add 3 shakes of Worcestershire sauce and Tabasco (or more if you like it very spicy) and a pinch of celery salt and pepper. Stir until the outside of the jug feels cold, then strain the cocktail into 2 tall glasses.

Top up with fresh ice, add a celery stick and lemon slice to both glasses and enjoy.

Cosmopolitan

45ml Lemon Vodka
15ml Triple Sec
30ml Cranberry Juice
10ml Lime juice
ice
orange zest, or a lime wedge on the rim
of the glass.

Shake ingredients in a cocktail shaker with ice and strain into a cocktail glass.

To make the garnish: hold a 3cm round piece of orange zest about 10cm above your cosmo and very carefully wave it over a lit match or lighter flame. Bend the outer edge of the zest in towards the flame so that the orange oils are released, then drop the zest into your drink.

Classic 60's Appetiser Devilled Eggs

INGREDIENTS

12 large free-range eggs
4 tbsp mayonnaise
1–2 tsp English mustard
1 tsp sea salt flakes
¼ paprika, plus extra for sprinkling

few drops Tabasco
2 tbsp extra virgin olive oil
2–3 tbsp water from a freshly boiled kettle
2 tsp finely chopped chives

METHOD

Bring some water to the boil in a large saucepan. One by one, add the eggs and bring back to the boil.

After boiling the eggs for 1 minute, turn the heat off and leave to stand in the pan for 12 minutes.

Fill a large bowl with very cold water. As soon as the eggs have had their 12 minutes, one by one, add the eggs into the cold water and leave for 15 minutes before peeling.

Halve the eggs lengthways and gently prise the yolks out of each half, putting them into a mixing bowl.

Add the mayonnaise, a teaspoon of English mustard, salt, paprika and a few drops of Tabasco to the yolks. Stir and mash with a fork, then blend with a stick blender or in a food processor.

Add the oil and blend again until smooth. It will be very thick. Check for taste and add further seasoning if required.

By hand, stir in as much of the water as needed, to help form a piping consistency.

Spoon mixture into a piping bag with a star icing nozzle, then pipe away, filling the hollowed-out whites with golden rosettes.

Or you can mound the yolk mixture using a pair of teaspoons.

Sprinkle with paprika and serve.

Classic 60's Main Chicken Casserole Recipe

INGREDIENTS

8 bone-in chicken thighs

1 tbsp oil

2 garlic cloves, crushed

2 celery sticks, thickly sliced

2 carrots, cut into 2 cm chunks

2 leeks, cut into 2 cm chunks

600 g potatoes, peeled & cut into large chunks

1 level thsp plain flour

600 ml hot chicken stock

2 rosemary sprigs

half a lemon

Yields: Approx. 4 servings

Prep Time:

Cook Time: 45 mins

METHOD

Preheat oven to 200°C (180°C fan oven) mark 6

Heat the oil in a casserole dish or wide pan with a lid and brown the chicken thighs.

Add the onion, garlic, celery, carrots, leeks and potatoes to the pan, and cook for 5-10min, stirring constantly.

Stir in the flour and cook for 2 min.

Gradually pour in the stock.

Season well, then return the browned chicken to the pan.

Add the rosemary, squeeze over the juice from the lemon half and pop the squeezed lemon half into the pan.

Cover and bring the casserole to the boil.

Place in the oven for 25-30 min until the chicken is cooked through and the sauce is piping hot and thickened.

Why not pair it with a classic 1960's wine like Blue Nun or Mateus Rose!



Serve with mashed potatoes, boiled potatoes, or rice.







Classic 60's Pudding Trifle

INGREDIENTS

1 x 85 g Packet of Jelly
2 Jam Rolls cut into 1 cm slices
1/2 Cup Sherry or Orange Juice
1 kg Custard
2 Cans Peaches, drained and diced
500 a Strawberries, hulled and halved

350 ml Whipping Cream 1 tsp Vanilla Essence 1 tbsp Icing Sugar Raspberries Shaved Chocolate

METHOD

Prepare the jelly as stated on the packet and pour into a dish. Refrigerate overnight or until set.

Place slices of the jam roll around the inner edge of the trifle bowl and three pieces in the bottom of the bowl.

Drizzle half of the sherry (or orange juice) over the sponge.

Add just under half of the custard, spreading with a spatula to create a smooth layer.

Place a layer diced peaches, jelly pieces and half the sliced strawberries.

Add another thin layer of custard and the last layer of jam rolls.

Drizzle the remaining sherry (or orange juice) over the sponge slices.

Top with the remainder of the custard, peaches, jelly and strawberries.

Cover this with plastic wrap and place in the refrigerator allowing the pudding to chill for at least 4 hours.

WHEN READY TO SERVE:

Whisk together the cream, vanilla essence and icing sugar in a bowl, being careful not to overbeat.

Add to the top of the trifle and decorate with raspberries and shaved chocolate.

REMINISCENCE TOYS OF THE 1960s



DOLLS

The Sindy doll was launched in September 1963 as the British rival to the American made Barbie. Sindy's boyfriend Paul, was released in 1965, and later her younger sister Patch in 1966. Sindy was the best selling toy in Britain in 1968 which was also the year her friends Vicki and Mitzi, and Patch's friends Poppet and Betsy made their debut.

Tiny Tears first appeared in UK stores in 1966 and was a Drink-and-Wet doll meaning the doll could be 'fed' water which then made them cry and wet their nappies.


BUILDING SETS

On Monday 25th January 1960 LEGO first went on sale in the UK and can still be found in shops today. In 1961 Airfix launched their Betta Bilda sets for 10 shillings each. Meccano, which was first invented 1898, was still a popular toy during the 1960s.








Andy Warhol American, 1928–1987

Andy Warhol first exhibited his, now iconic, Campbell's soup can paintings in 1962. This ground-breaking exhibition marked a pivotal moment in the art world, as Warhol challenged traditional notions of fine art by drawing inspiration from popular culture and commercial goods. His work blurred the lines between high and low art, sparking conversations about consumerism, mass production, and the role of art in society. Andy Warhol also made his first original Marilyn Monroe painting in 1962.

Andy Warhol today is known as a leading figure in the Pop Art movement.

Roy Lichtenstein was another American Pop Art artist during the 1960s. He also became a leading figure in the new art movement with his comic book style paintings.

PRIME MINISTER HAROLD WILSON

On 16th October of 1964 Labour's representative Harold Wilson become prime minister, winning the general election with a narrow majority of only four seats.

Wilson remained Prime Minister until 19th June 1970, serving again between 1974 and 1976, when he resigned.

THE FIRST LABOUR GOVERNMENT SINCE 1951

Wilson's government saw the implementation of social reforms in housing, health, gender equality, racial equality and education. Comprehensive schools were established in July 1965, offering education to all students equally, eliminating the distinction between grammar schools, which required passing an 11-plus exam, and secondary modern schools.

MARILYN MONROE

Actress Marilyn Monroe passed away on 5 August 1962 after taking an overdose of sleeping pills. The news of her death inspired popular 1960 artist Andy Warhol to create his first Marilyn silkscreen paintings later that month.

THE 1966 WORLD CUP

In 1966 England won the World Cup with a 4-2 victory over West Germany.

George Cohen, a footballer who started every England game in the 1966 World Cup including the final, was on a wage of around £80 a week – roughly £1,400 in today's money, which is less than current England captain Wayne Rooney earns in an hour.

Until 18th January 1961, a maximum wage of £20 a week was all an England football player could earn.
